One of the highlights in self-taught art is a masterpiece by American artist Purvis Young (1943-2010). The large untitled piece known as "Father of the Peoples," an assemblage with house paint on wood, dates to 1991. Measuring 52 inches by 100 inches, the painting centers on a haloed figure robed in shades of white and cream, arms stretching upwards. Expressive faces touched with hues of red, brown and white, some of them also haloed, appear around the frame. From the Overtown section of Miami, Florida, Young is famous for blending the African American experience in the south with his private study of the masters of art history in his paintings, collages, and found media artwork. He began drawing as a teenager during a period spent in prison, and his move to painting was initially inspired by the mural movements of other large cities. His work, which shows the influence of Young's private study of Rembrandt, El Greco, van Gogh, Gaugin, and Picasso, attracted the attention of Bernard Davis, owner of the Miami Art Museum, and eventually the praise of collectors and institutions around the country. Today, his pieces appear in many museums throughout the country, including the High Museum in Atlanta, the Smithsonian American Art Museum and the Corcoran Gallery of Arts in Washington DC, the American Folk Art Museum in Atlanta, and the Philadelphia Museum of Art, amongst others.



An early piece by Nigerian self-taught



artist Prince Twins Seven-Seven (1944-2011) also leads the sale. Prince was an original member of the acclaimed Osogbo School, named for the Yoruba town Osogbo, which had its roots in the Mbari Mbayo Club created by Ulli and Georgina Beier to foster young artists. Intricate in both style and cosmology, his works are detailed at every layer, portraying spirits with double eyes, plants teeming with patterns, animals whose decoration are revealed to be smaller animals, all evocations of the forces, the impulses and narratives of his complex worlds. The universes of gods and men shown in Prince's paintings, and many of the elements of his own personal mythology, have their roots in the artist's profound connection to traditional Yoruba beliefs. "The Smelling Ghost" (1966; 31.5" x 39.5"), a work of ink, watercolor and oil on brown paper, is featured in Henry Glassie's book "Prince Twins SevenSeven: His Art, His Life in Nigeria, His Exile in America." This painting depicts a spirit called Ologbonkian, a destroyer of the herbs and leaves that doctors use for healing. Prince describes the smell of the ghost as being similar to a variety of poisonous rat, and catching his scent will mean that the nearby herbs have been sapped of their medicinal powers. The painting bears a resemblance to a painting titled "Elephant Man," which appears in Ulli Beier's "Contemporary Art in Africa," although "The Smelling Ghost" is easily distinguished by the electric blue of its background. One of Africa's most famous contemporary artists, Prince's international fame has garnered him exhibitions on every continent, and a place in the permanent collections of major museums around the world, including the Smithsonian Institution, the Indianapolis Museum of Art, and the Museum of Modern Art in New York. In 2005, he was designated UNESCO Artist for Peace.



Another highlight of the sale includes an important work by Sister Gertrude Morgan (1900-1980), entitled "New Jerusalem." A preacher, missionary, musician and poet who worked in New Orleans, Sister Gertrude is now known primarily for her folk art. Brightly-colored and joyous, her paintings and drawings depict religious scenes, inspired by the Book of Revelations, illustrations of her sermons, or other conceptualizations of a Biblical idea. According to the American Museum of Folk Art, which holds some of her work, her vision of a New Jerusalem is her most important theme. This painting, measuring 22 inches by 14 inches, bears many of the hallmarks of Morgan's representation of the New Jerusalem, including multistoried houses, flowering trees and a sky arrayed with angels of many ethnicities. Sister Morgan frequently appeared within her own work, and the figure dressed in white standing in front of the building, just to the left of center, is likely a depiction of the artist. Around 1957, Sister Morgan received a revelation that she was to become the "bride of Christ," and thereafter she dressed only in white. Her many revelations throughout her life included one in 1974 that instructed her to move away from painting and devote herself to poetry, and in later life she produced text-only pieces. Text is frequently an integral part of her work in the decades prior, however; this painting bears an inscription in the blue and white of the sky above the building, reading "that great ship is landing,""paradise," and "get on board."



Although he lived much of his life in the United States, Felipe Jesus Consalvos (1891-1960) was born in Cuba, and his work draws on the Cuban vernacular tradition of cigar band collage. Working as a cigar roller for much of his life, Consalvos transformed the tradition that surrounded him into a complex, sophisticated blend of political satire and Dadaist absurdism. From his birth outside of Havana. Cuba. to his emigration to Miami in 1920, and later, to Brooklyn and then Philadelphia, he became highly skilled in the creation of playful collages on paper. His piece at auction, "Built - Not Stuffed" derives its title from a clipping of that phrase incorporated into the work. Consalvos frequently


jests with social issues, and the phrase could refer to the woman's brassiere, outfitted in the collage with two round ones from a dollar bill, or the bird's head which has replaced her own. Political figures frequently appear in Consalvos' mixed media pieces, seen here in George Washington's head placed atop a foreign body which rides on the legs of a carousel horse. Consalvos was not known as an artist during his lifetime, but his work has been shown in larger exhibitions across the country, in Italy, and in Switzerland, and are in the permanent collections of museums such as the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the High Museum of Art and the American Folk Art Museum.

Thornton Dial (b. 1928), another self-taught artist from Alabama, is represented at auction by five works, including an untitled painting of a woman, measuring 16 inches by 20 inches. The yellow-peach color of the woman's skin is streaked with black, predominantly on her cheeks and breasts, and her eyes appear bloodshot. A blue and red bird curves above the crest of her black hair. The piece uses pencil, charcoal and watercolor. Dial's work frequently explores the political and historical issues of the United States, such as war, racism, and homelessness,

sometimes in very large canvases and utilizing found objects. Of his drawings, however, the majority depict women, whether they are real-life portraits or imagined figures. His work appears in the permanent collections of numerous museums around the country, including the Whitney Museum and the American Folk Art Museum in New York, the Hirshhorn Museum and the Smithsonian American Art Museum in Washington DC, Intuit in Chicago, the New Orleans Museum of Art and the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

Another self-taught American painter with six works in the auction is Jim Bloom (b. 1968), who was recently the subject of an essay titled "Stories of Wit and Irony" by Ron Schira in *Raw Vision Magazine* (Spring / Summer 2012, RV 75, p. 44-47). Using collage, drawing and painting, Bloom conjures an immediacy of action, story and relationship. A carton of milk is tipped midair while figures wrestle beneath it in his piece "Spilled Milk," a mixed media collage on wood. Measuring 31 inches by 24 inches. Bloom's other piece (Lot 214), dated 2007, is titled "Baby Sitters Boyfriend," in which we guess that the nude figures may be the baby sitter and boyfriend named, surprised by the furious mother at right. Made with acrylic and mixed media on stretched canvas, this 61 inch by 73 inch piece.





A significant portion of the sale consists of folk art from the United States and around the globe. Leading this category are two fine Cigar Store Indian statues. One is attributed to John L. Cromwell, (1805-1873) who is credited as being one of the first carvers of these kinds of figures to arrive from England. Standing an impressive 87 inches tall, the statue dates to circa 1850 and shows the male figure with a hatchet raised in his right hand. Though these hand-carved statues were once frequent sights in front of 19th century cigar stores, original examples are now extremely rare, and highly collectable due to the resurgent popularity of cigars and related memorabilia. The second statue presents a variation on this form, with a Cigar Store Indian Maiden by Thomas by Thomas V. Brooks (1826-1895). Measuring 85 inches by 25 inches 25.5 inches, this brightly-attired maiden holds up a set of cigars. Brooks was a student of John Cromwell; along with Samuel Anderson Robb, and the Skillin family, Cromwell and Brooks are considered the most prominent Cigar Store Indian craftsmen of the 19th century. The folklore about Cigar Store Indians in the late 18th century suggests that they provided a visual marker, much like a barber's striped pole, for customers who were illiterate, or, in the following century, for the swelling population of immigrants that spoke different languages.





Another highlight of American folk art at the auction is a weathervane made by the Boston manufacturer Harris and Company, dating to circa 1890. Immortalized by and modeled after an 1847 Currier and Ives print, a copper horse depicting the trotter Black Hawk sits atop the weathervane and has a patina of green verdigris on the surface, consistent with its age. It measures 25.5 inches by 19 inches by 1.5 inches.



This rare Cameo Glass "Blue Dog" vase was designed by George Rodrigue (American/Louisiana, B. 1944). Famous for his series of Blue Dog paintings, George Rodrigue collaborated with Kelsey Murphy and Pilgrim Glass in West Virginia between 1993 and 1995 to create a limited number of Blue Dog designs as cameo glass. Only three bowls and a vase, each in editions of thirty-five, were created as part of this collaboration. The underside of this rare and exquisite vase is etched with the limited edition number 31/35 as well as the Pilgrim Glass mark. An inventory label is also affixed. The vase measures Size:  $11" \times 7" \times 7"$ . George Rodrigue's works have been exhibited in galleries and museums all over the world and between 1977 and 1981 his work was chosen by the US State Department to be the official gifts for visiting foreign heads of state. Novelty items such as this vase, however, were primarily created for his private collection and so were made in limited editions and seldom come on the market. The Blue Dog series was inspired by the Cajun legend of the loupe-garou and the layered glass of the vase was sandblasted to reveal Rodrigue's raised patterns. A number of books have been written about Rodrigue's "Blue Dog" works including, among others, The Blue Dog, Blue Dog Man, Blue Dog Christmas, Why Is Blue Dog Blue and Are You Blue Dog's Friend.



Ethnographic art at the sale includes pieces from the Bill Liske Collection of Antique Tibetan and Chinese Textiles and Artifacts, the harvest of three decades of Liske's travel and work in the Himalayan region. Originally a mountaineer and guide, Liske's natural eye for textiles was honed by textile dealers in the area. In 1998, he curated an exhibition of his work entitled 'From the Heart of a Continent: Carpets and Textiles of the Tibetan Realm,' in his home state of Colorado, at the History Museum in Denver. Pieces from his collection have also been shown at the Krimsa Gallery in San Francisco,

the Shaver-Ramsey Gallery in Denver, and in Hali magazine. One of the most remarkable pieces from his collection to appear in this sale is a Buddhist manuscript cover dating to the 12th-13th centuries. Made of wood and bearing traces of paint, the cover features Amoghasiddhi, the last of the Five Wisdom Buddhas of the Vajrayana tradition of Buddhism, flanked by scrolling vines. The name 'Amoghasiddhi' means 'unfailing success,' and, as the Buddha of accomplishing wisdom, he is identified by the hand gesture symbolizing fearlessness. What is unique about this particular

portrayal is the altered 'fear not' hand position of Amoghassidhi, with the left hand, and not right hand, lifted, while the right hand is draped across the knees, not placed in the lap. This Tibetan piece is strikingly similar in size, style and composition to the Metropolitan Museum's Budhhist Manuscript cover with Buddha Shakyamuni flanked by Manjushri and Vajrapani (accession # 1987.407.6), dated as early 12th century.

This beautiful, 15th century Ming Dynasty Chinese silk textile is in excellent condition. The richly colored and elaborately patterned textile depicts a complex lattice design pattern with plum blossoms interspersed and a border composed of stretched green dragons. As the first flower to bloom after winter, the plum blossoms symbolize courage and hope and are a symbol of longevity. In the top half of the textile a central medallion containing four blue dragons stretched among floral scrolls and encircling a floral motif overlays the lattice design and in the bottom half a rectangle frames two Chinese guardian lions with earth imagery below, heavenly clouds above and a coin-like motif in between. The lions were believed to have powerful, mystic protective benefits, the dragons were symbols of nobility and strength and the coin was symbolic of wealth and prosperity. The textile was possibly used as a chair cover. Displayed mounted and stretched, the piece measures 33" x 20.5″.



This rare and difficult to find 19th to early 20th century woman's wool dress was collected by Bill Liske several decades ago while traveling through the Himalayas. It is a wool, sul-ma tie-dyed dress and was a traditional garment for women in the nomadic communities of the Chang Tang plateau, an area that stretches from Tibet to Ladakh, India. The dress is made of a flatwoven woolen fabric called snambu and tie-dyed with tigma crosses that are symbols of good luck and well being. Its vibrant burgundy, blue, red, gold and green colors make for a stunning wall display.



From a Haverford, PA estate, a very fine Dogon Helmet rounds out the African art offerings and expresses the range of ethnic folk expression. The profound abstraction found in Dogon arts is exemplified by this helmet mask and keeps true to the reverence to Animism. In the Dogon culture an emphasis on harmony manifests itself in several rituals that celebrates the dichotomy between male and female, old and young, and with the use of masks such as this, Animal and Man. A standout in any collection.



Also featured in the sale is a Lower Sepik River carved Ancestor Figure. From New Guinea, figures like this would be found among other in the "Haus Tambaran" or "Spirit House" which serves as a pagan temple, men's clubhouse, and museum for sacred objects used in the rites of the all male secret society which dominates village life. These figures represent certain founding ancestors or cultural heroes, but various spirit beings as well. This figure is crested and horned with cowrie shell eyes. Remnants of paint possibly of tribal tattoos are evident around eyes and body.



A wooden staff made by the Yoruba people, who predominantly live in Nigeria, represents the god Shango or Sango, known as the god of lightning, thunder and fire. Shango's weapon is double-headed ax, seen at the top of the staff, and the figure below it may be a devotee of Shango struggling to maintain self-control, one possible purpose of religious rituals for the god. The staff was probably carved in the early 20th century and measures 22 inches by 8 inches by 4 inches.



tems from the Max Garb Collection of Ethnographic Arts, subject of its own auction at Material Culture on April 28, include an exemplary African power or fetish figure replete with real pelts, bones, and skulls. Made by the Songye people of the Democratic Republic of Congo, the figure measures 43 inches by 15 inches by 12 inches. Implied by its stature, it is considered a community power figure devised to protect the entire village from a commonly held threat of danger or infliction. Important to its symbolic power is the use of the pelts, bones, teeth, and horns of notoriously dangerous animals and is fashioned to appear chiefly in rank. Ceremoniously, the entire village would be involved in the evolution of the figure from tree to final form.



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**ABSENTEE AND PHONE BIDDING.** Absentee and phone bidding are permitted by prospective bidders who cannot be present at the auction. Please complete the Absentee Bid and/or Phone Reservation form. Absentee bids are executed competitively and confidentially. All reservations for phone bidding are held in the strictest confidence and must be received by 5 pm EST the day before the auction. No additional phone bids will be accepted at such time including additions when speaking with a staff person on the phone. Written absentee bids may be submitted on the Absentee Bid Form up to 30 lots before the item comes up for auction. Leaving an absentee or phone bid on a lot indicates your willingness to open the bidding at one half the printed estimate, and gives the auctioneer the authority to open the bidding at that level, or to open the bidding on a lot with a printed reserve at the reserve price. In the case of identical absentee bids, the bid received first will prevail. Bids left on liveauctioneers. com are not executed until the item is offered in the live auction and the order in which they are received is not a factor.

**CUT BIDS.** We do not accept cut bids, (bids less than the last interval) from the floor or from absentee bidders including phone and internet bidders. Thus, it is possible that a lot could go to another bidder for less than an absentee bid. For example, if the bids are progressing in \$10 dollar increments and an absentee falls at a \$5 increment we will not take the bid since it is less than the \$10 increment. Following are general guidelines for bidding increments:

In the case of a disputed bid, the auctioneer shall have sole discretion in determining the Buyer and may also, at his or her election, withdraw the Property or reoffer the Property for sale. The auctioneer shall have sole discretion to refuse any bid, or refuse to acknowledge any bidder. At such time as the auctioneer has declared Property sold to a given Buyer, said Buyer thereupon assumes full risk and responsibility for the Property, agrees to sign any requested confirmation of purchase, and agrees to pay the full price, plus Buyer's Premium, therefore or such part, upon such terms as MC may require.

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**REMOVAL OF PROPERTY.** All items must be picked up, or shipping arrangements made, within two weeks of the day of sale. Items not collected or shipped by the 15th day following the sale will incur storage fees at a rate of \$5.00 per lot per day regardless of the size or value of the lot. Items not collected by the 30th day following the sale may be sold by MC or sent by MC to a public warehouse at the sole risk of, and charge to, the Buyer and MC may prohibit the Buyer from participating, directly or indirectly, as a bidder or purchaser in any future sale. No Property may be removed from MC's premises until the Buyer has paid in full the purchase price including Buyer's premium. MC shall have no liability for any damage to Property left on its premises after the auction. A defaulting Buyer will be deemed to have granted and assigned to MC a continuing security interest of first priority in any Property or money of, or owing to such Buyer in MC's possession, and MC may retain and apply such Property or money as collateral security for the obligations due to MC. MC shall have all of the rights accorded a secured party under the Pennsylvania Uniform Commercial Code.

**PACKING AND SHIPPING.** Buyer agrees that packing and shipping are done at the Buyer's risk and that Buyer will pay in advance all packing expenses, materials, carrier fees and insurance charges. Shipping is the sole responsibility of the Buyer. MC will have no liability for any loss or damage to shipped items. Upon request, MC will provide a list of shippers who deliver to destinations within the United States and overseas.

**TAXES.** All purchases are subject to Pennsylvania sales tax unless the Buyer possesses a Pennsylvania sales tax exemption number. Exemption numbers from other states are accepted in Pennsylvania if presented with a business card or letterhead. Dealers, museums, and other qualifying parties can apply for a Pennsylvania exemption number prior to the auction. Buyer is responsible for any and all tariffs, taxes and assessments that might be made on the Property. International Buyers are responsible for tariffs, taxes, or assessments of shipped items to the Buyer's country.

**IMPORT/EXPORT RESTRICTIONS.** Some property that is sold at auction can be subject to laws governing export from the United States, such as items that include material from some endangered species. Import restrictions from foreign countries are subject to these same governing laws. Granting of licensing for import or export of Property from local authorities is the sole responsibility of the Buyer. Denial or delay of licensing will not constitute cancellation or delay in payment for the total purchase price of said Property.

**BUYER'S BREACH.** If the Buyer breaches any of its obligations under this Agreement, including its obligation to pay in full the purchase price of all Property for which it is the highest successful bidder, MC may exercise all of its rights and remedies under the law including, without limitation, (a) cancelling the sale and applying any payments made by the Buyer to the damages caused by the Buyer's breach, and/or (b) offering at public auction, without reserve, any lot or item for which the Buyer has failed to pay in full the purchase price, holding the Buyer liable for any deficiency plus all costs of sale.

**GOVERNING LAW.** These conditions of sale shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (excluding the laws applicable to conflicts or choice of law). The Buyer agrees that any suit for the enforcement of this Agreement may be brought, and any action against MC in connection with the transactions contemplated by this Agreement shall be brought, in the courts of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any federal court sitting therein. The Buyer consents to the nonexclusive jurisdiction of such courts and waives objections that it may now or hereafter have to the venue of any such suit.

**AMENDMENTS TO TERMS AND CONDITIONS.** No claimed modification or amendment of this Agreement on the part of any party shall be deemed extant, enforceable or provable unless it is in writing that has been signed by the parties to this Agreement. No course of dealing and no delay or omission on the part of MC in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of such right or any other right and waiver on any one or more occasions shall not be construed as a bar to or waiver of any right or remedy of MC on any future occasion.
